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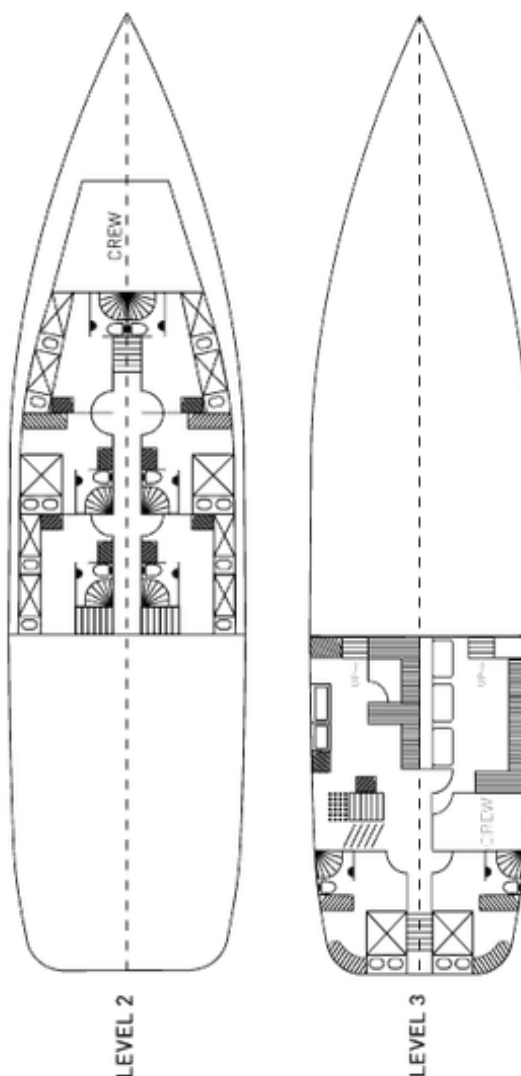

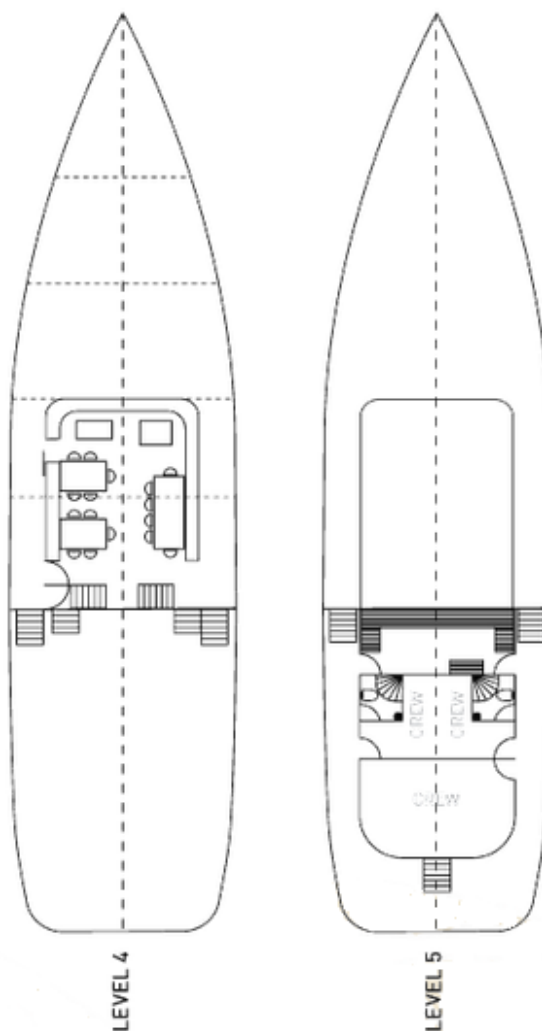
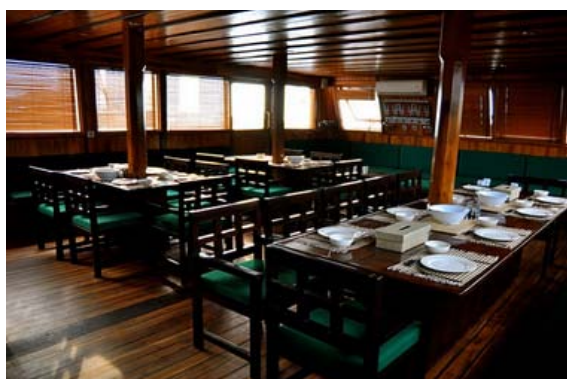
Lunch: buffet-style, with a different range of Indonesian favorites every day.

Tambora Liveaboard offers great comfort and flair, and at the same time is optimally geared towards supporting a diving operation in terms of safety, convenience, and efficiency. Tambora Liveaboard has an old world's charm and style as a result of has been built by traditional boat builders on the island of Sulawesi, in the centuries-old tradition of a wooden Phinisi. The design and materials used guarantee immense strength and resilience of all key structural elements, especially the keel, hull and decks.

The vessel has been entirely constructed out of Sulawesi iron wood and chosen Javanese teak. While her hull has been painted white, the superstructure,



decks and roofs have all been finished with a view towards preserving the natural beauty of the teak wood. All decks and the salon rooftop feature teak parquet flooring.

All guest suites and rooms on board have been designed by a renowned Indonesian interior designer, and built-to-design by an experienced interior architect. Guest suites are well appointed and tastefully designed in a perfect blend of traditional Indonesian motifs and modern functionality.

Tambora Liveaboard offers all 21st century luxury & amenities that you can imagine. Space is at a premium on a ship. Hence, Tambora has been sized and configured to comfortably accommodate a maximum of 16 divers in eight spacious guest suites, each at least 15m² in size, and with a large en-suite bathroom with the choice of double and large twin beds and no bunk beds. All beds longitudinally aligned with the vessel, so our guests sleep in the direction of the vessel movement. Each guest suite comes with a writing desk and ample storage space for cloths, bags, books, magazines, etc.

The large salon with separate dining and relaxing sections, offers enough space during mealtimes, as well as for chilling out over a chat and drinks with fellow divers, with a book in your hands, or working on your laptop. Three separate lounge decks – bow, aft and salon rooftop – provide enough space and privacy, and can be fully shielded from the sun.

Throughout the entire vessel, separating walls have been soundproofed with noise absorbing materials. The engine room bulkheads are extra thick to absorb engine noise. Similarly, all ceilings and decks have been soundproofed to mitigate step noise. Her five-blade propeller is made of a special, very stiff alloy, minimizing internal vibration of the blades which are a key source of structural noise.

Trekking in Baliem Valley

If yours is an adventurous spirit, a fascinating expedition in Baliem Valley will fulfill all your expectations... The highlands of Irian Jaya, is the region inhabited by the Dani Tribes and other sub tribes as Yali and Lani. The many different tribes have lived scattered across the highland plateau for 1000 years, they are small agrarian clans, isolated by the harsh terrain and divided by language, custom and tradition. This will be a journey through the time to encounter complex and primitive cultures, that look as come out of "the stone age".



Touring Trans Flores Highway

From Labuanbajo to Maumere, inland excursion discovering volcanoes, traditional villages and fascinating encounters with ethnic groups, as the Manggarai and the Ngada people, they still practice ancestral traditions, syncretism of animistic beliefs and Christianity. We will expend unforgettable time visiting Wae Rebo an old Manggaraian village, situated in pleasant, isolated mountain scenery; also Kelimutu, the three colors lake in the cone of a extinct volcano; and more.

Traversing 2 km of a beautiful plateau, with hundred of separate terraced plumes, the falls have seven main terraces, each with its own natural bathing pool. The top of the waterfall is some 100 meters above is basin pool.
